INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF YAYASAN FOOD BANK MALAYSIA

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of YAYASAN FOOD BANK MALAYSIA, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2022, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, as set out on pages 10 to 28.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Foundation as at 31 December 2022, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards, International Financial Reporting Standards and the Trustees (Incorporation) Act, 1952 in Malaysia.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with approved standards on auditing in Malaysia and International Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.
