YAYASAN FOOD BANK MALAYSIA (YFBM) was established on 7 January 2019 as a Non-Profit @ Non-Government Organization (NGO) that actively work on social responsibility programs. We are registered under the Legal Affairs Division of Prime Minister Department under the Act of Trustee (Incorporation) 1952[Act 258].

Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia aims to be a catalyst in efforts to reduce food waste and address the issue of rising living costs, especially for the poor and underprivileged groups. We strive to rescue surplus food from manufacturers,

wholesalers, hypermarkets, and the industry and redistribute it to targeted B40 communities identified through our strategic partners. The targeted communities include students in higher education institutions (IPTs), urban and rural poor, coastal fishermen, rubber tappers, indigenous people, and welfare homes.

Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia (YFBM) visions becoming the leading food bank system in Malaysia by 2030, guided by a strong commitment to expand its reach and ensure that its services are accessible to communities nationwide. - **Step 1: Goods Received and Inventory Entry**

When contributors donate goods, the items are first received and logged into the inventory system. This initial step ensures that every donation is accounted for and tracked accurately.

- **Step 2: Sorting and Quality Inspection**

Next, the goods are sorted according to their inventory categories. During this stage, items undergo a thorough inspection to ensure they meet quality standards. This step is crucial to maintain the integrity and safety of the food distributed.

- **Step 3: Storage Post-inspection**

The goods are stored according to their categories. Proper storage conditions are maintained to preserve the quality and longevity of the food items.

- **Step 4: Distribution**

The final step involves distributing the stored goods according to the approved allocations. The distribution process ensures that the food reaches those in need efficiently and effectively.

IMPACT SUMMARY

In 2025, Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia (YFBM) continued to strengthen its role as a national platform for food recovery and community support, delivering impact across environmental, social, and operational dimensions through an integrated and structured approach.

Through its food rescue initiatives, surplus food was recovered and redistributed to communities in need, reducing waste while preserving the value of existing resources within the supply chain. This contributes to more responsible consumption practices while improving access to food among vulnerable groups.

At the same time, programme interventions translated donor funding into direct assistance for communities nationwide. By delivering essential food support through organised programmes, YFBM helped to ease immediate financial pressure on households, enabling families to better manage limited resources and maintain stability during periods of economic challenge.

These impact streams are supported by a coordinated operational infrastructure that enables the efficient collection, management, and distribution of resources. By integrating logistics, partnerships, and delivery mechanisms within a single system, YFBM ensures that both recovered food and programme assistance are translated into consistent and scalable outcomes.

Collectively, this integrated model demonstrates how resources can be optimised to generate multi-dimensional impact through the reduction of food waste, the strengthening of food security, and the support of community resilience, while maintaining transparency and accountability in delivery.

SURPLUS IMPACT SUMMARY

Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia food rescue efforts focus on recovering surplus food and redirecting it to communities in need, reducing food waste while improving access to essential resources. Through a structured recovery network, surplus food is collected, sorted, and redistributed efficiently across multiple locations.

This process transforms excess supply into usable value, ensuring that edible food is not lost within the supply chain. By bridging the gap between surplus and need, YFBM enables continuous redistribution that supports both environmental sustainability and food security.

The impact extends beyond waste reduction. Recovered food contributes directly to community support efforts, providing an additional source of food assistance without increasing resource consumption. This reinforces a circular approach to food utilisation, where value is preserved and extended.

From an environmental perspective, food rescue reduces landfill dependency and supports responsible consumption practices. Socially, it enhances food availability for vulnerable groups. Together, these outcomes demonstrate how surplus food can be repurposed into meaningful and measurable impact.

Methodology Note

Impact figures are derived from a combination of verified operational data and standardised ESG proxy calculations. Food quantities are based on actual surplus recovered, while meal estimates are calculated using a 0.35 kg per meal benchmark aligned with local reporting practices. Environmental impact estimates are based on standardised conversion factors informed by global food waste studies, including references from the Food and Agriculture Organization and the United Nations Environment Programme. Certain indicators, including household reach, are presented as estimates for indicative purposes.

PROGRAM IMPACT SUMMARY

Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia programme interventions translate donor funding into direct assistance for vulnerable communities through structured nationwide implementation. By delivering essential food support through organised programmes, resources are channelled efficiently to those most in need.

At the household level, food assistance helps to ease immediate financial strain by offsetting basic food expenditure. This enables families to preserve limited income and reallocate resources towards other essential needs, contributing to improved financial stability during periods of economic pressure.

At the community level, programme implementation contributes to local economic activity by directing resources into supply and distribution networks. This creates a dual effect supporting both beneficiaries and the broader ecosystem involved in delivering essential goods.

Through a coordinated delivery approach, programmes are implemented consistently across locations while maintaining accountability in the use of funds. This ensures that assistance is delivered effectively and transparently.

Overall, YFBM's programme model demonstrates how targeted funding can generate meaningful outcomes strengthening food access, reducing financial vulnerability, and supporting community level resilience.

Methodology Note

Programme impact is based on restricted funds utilised for programme implementation. Average household benefit is estimated at RM100 per family based on standard food assistance value. Programme expenditure includes food procurement, distribution, and logistics-related costs, excluding staff costs. All figures are reported in accordance with YFBM's internal ESG-aligned measurement framework.

OPERATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE NARRATIVE

Yayasan Food Bank Malaysia's operational infrastructure serves as the foundation that enables both food recovery and programme delivery at scale. By integrating logistics, coordination, and distribution within a single system, YFBM ensures that resources are efficiently translated into measurable impact.

Through this system, operational activities support the simultaneous delivery of environmental and social outcomes. Surplus food is recovered and redirected to communities in need, while structured programmes ensure consistent assistance reaches targeted beneficiaries.

Operational investment functions as an enabler of value creation. It supports the conversion of resources into tangible outcomes across the impact chain from collection and handling to distribution and final delivery ensuring consistency and scalability in impact delivery.

From a governance perspective, structured processes and coordinated implementation ensure accountability, traceability, and effective resource management. This reinforces confidence in how both recovered resources and programme funds are managed.

Overall, YFBM's operational model highlights the importance of infrastructure in sustaining impact, enabling the organisation to deliver consistent, scalable, and multidimensional outcomes.

After making a donation, save your proof of payment either as a screenshot or PDF file. Proof of payment is important for us to review and verify the donation transaction.



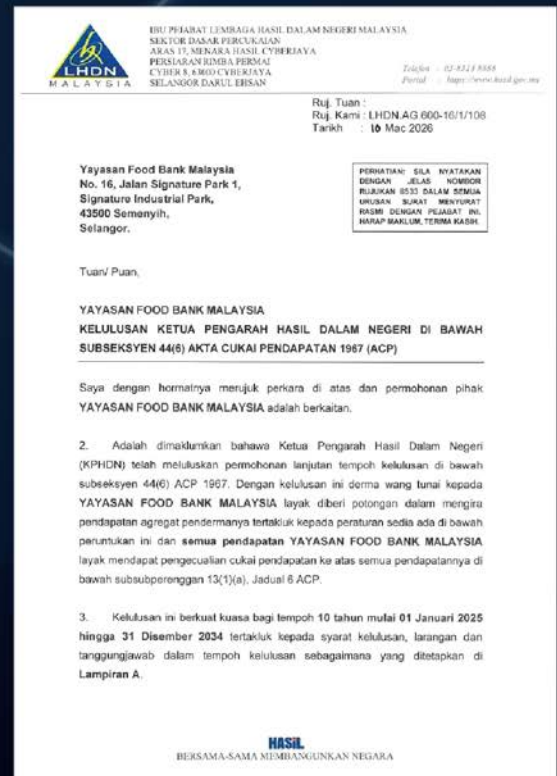
FILL IN THE APPLICATION FORM

FOOD DONORS PROTECTION ACT 2020

The Food Donors Protection Act have been gazetted on 10 February 2020 which gives protection to food donors from civil liability.

PROTECTION OF FOOD DONORS

A food donor shall not be liable for any civil liability against any personal injury, or illness suffered by any person or the death of any such person resulting from consumption of food donated or distributed by food donors unless it can be proven that :



NON-COMPLIANCE WITH FOOD SAFETY LAWS

The food donor does not comply with any requirements related to food safety and hygiene under any written law before donating or distributing the food.



UNSAFE FOOD AT THE TIME OF DONATION

The food is not safe to be consumed at the time it is donated or distributed to any person.



NEGLIGENCE OR MISCONDUCT BY DONOR

Any personal injury, illness, or death caused by negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the food donor.



LACK OF GOOD FAITH

The donation or distribution of food is not carried out in good faith.
